## BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Creative Digital Media

- Learners develop an understanding of the media industry through analysing media representations and pitching and producing media projects.
- 4 Units studied
- 58% externally assessed



### WJEC Level 3 Diploma in Food Science & Nutrition

- Replacing the BTEC in Catering and Hospitality
- Qualification = 1 A Level
- Can be studied alongside other level 3 qualifications such as A levels or other BTEC Nationals
- Carry UCAS points and are widely recognised by employers



### WJEC Level 3 Diploma in Food Science & Nutrition

- Four units studied:
- Meeting Nutritional Needs of Specific Groups
- Ensuring Food is Safe to Eat
- Experimenting to Solve Food Production
- Current Issues in Food Science and Nutrition
- 50% externally assessed



## BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Business

- National Diploma = 2 A Levels
- Can be studied alongside other level 3
   qualifications such as A levels or other
   BTEC Nationals
- Carry UCAS points and are widely recognised by universities and employers



## BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Business

- 8 units studied including:
- Exploring Business, Developing a
   Marketing Campaign, Personal and
   Business Finance, Managing an Event,
   International Business, Principles of
   Management
- 45% externally assessed



# Level 3 BTEC National Extended Dip. Art & Design

- National Extended Diploma = 3 A Levels
- Studied as the only qualification in 6<sup>th</sup> Form
- Carry UCAS points and are widely recognised by universities and employers



# Level 3 BTEC National Extended Dip. Art & Design

- 13 units studied
- Learners gain knowledge and understanding of:
  - visual communication and the creative process to develop their creative voice.
  - the importance and influence of the work of artists and designers to develop and realise their creative intentions.
  - They produce a portfolio of art and design work to support progression to higher education.
  - Optional units allow learners to gain knowledge in areas such as fashion, textiles, graphics, photography, 3D studies and fine art.
- 42% external assessment



#### Subject combinations

Students will be required to study three A Level subjects or the equivalent.

- BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate in Business (1 A Level) with Sociology and PE
- 2. BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Business (2A Levels) with BTEC Level 3 National Extended Cert: Creative Media (1 A Level)
- 3. WJEC Level 3 Diploma in Food Science and Nutrition (1 A Level) with Nat Extend Cert in Business (2A Level)
- BTEC Level 3 National Extended Diploma Art and Design (3 A Level)



## Level 2 BTEC First Diploma Business

- Level 2 = GCSE Level
- BTEC First Diploma = 4 GCSEs
- Core, mandatory and optional units
- 12.5% externally assessed
- Enterprise, Finance, Small Business, Promoting a Brand, Marketing External, Project Management



#### Level 2 BTEC First Diploma Business

- One of the main purposes is to help learners to progress into employment.
- Teaching the employability skills of: selfmanagement, teamwork, business awareness and customer awareness, problem solving, communication, basic literacy and numeracy, a positive attitude to work, IT.
- Progress to Level BTEC / A levels also






