

# Y10 Assessment at JFS



- Students in Y10 receive a minimum target grade for each subject they are studying.
- This target has been generated from their end of KS2 level for English and maths.
- Student's should aim to meet or exceed their target, which we have calculated to be aspirational.
- If student's meet their target they are performing higher than an equivalent student based on national averages due to our aspirational target.
- A student's KS2 level is between 1 and 6.
- At KS2 level 1 is the lowest, 4 is the average and 6 is the highest possible level.
- For students that have not done KS2 tests at primary school we will use internal assessments to generate a minimum expected grade.
- Students progress will be monitored toward this grade.
- If we have calculated a minimum expected score of 6 at the end of their GCSEs we expect them to achieve an average score of 6 in all their assessments throughout the year. (please see diagram on next page)

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## Y10 Progress

Students are making progress if the score they get for each assessment is the same, as the content gets more challenging over time.

This should be at or above their minimum expected grade in order to demonstrate progress.

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## Y10 Progress Example

Below are some examples of KS2 levels and what their respective targets are.

A student who achieved a Level 4 in Year 6 could have got a high or low level 4 depending on how many marks they got in the assessments. So, their average KS2 level could be anything between 4.0 – 4.9. (see below the difference in minimum expectation between student B and C)

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The students in Y10 will get GCSE scores for their subjects which will be from 1-9.

Please look at the table on the right to see the comparison between the old GCSE grades and the new GCSE scores.

\*Ivrit in Y10 will still be assessed using the grades A\*-G.

\*\*As you can see from the chart above the 9 is above the current A\* and therefore we expect only the very highest attaining students to achieve this.

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## Assessment

Students in Y10 will be given a score from 1-9 for each assessment in their subjects. The scores 1-9 can be described as follows.

SCORE	Description of Score	A higher score in this band means...
7, 8, 9	Students demonstrate advanced knowledge and understanding of the key age related content and skills	Students show an increased depth of knowledge, are able to analyse, evaluate and synthesise information critically and accurately.
4, 5, 6	Students demonstrate secure knowledge and understanding of the key age related content and skills	Students are able to apply their knowledge, make comparisons and interpret information with increased accuracy.
1, 2, 3	Students have yet to demonstrate secure knowledge and understanding of the key age related content and skills	Students are demonstrating a more secure knowledge and comprehension of basic skills and processes and have greater retention of information.
