### What is LMI and how can it help me?

Labour Market Information (LMI) can help in providing a general guide to jobs and the job market.

It can help you to understand:

- Which jobs are growing and declining (locally and nationally)
- What jobs are in your region
- How much you might earn
- What qualifications you will need to do a job

It can also help you:

- Look at careers in different ways
- Consider aspects of jobs which you may not have thought about

LMI is a useful tool, particularly when you are considering your future career. Experts will consider whether the need for jobs is likely to increase, stay around the same or reduce. Some future jobs haven't even been invented yet!
